ABSENCES

The following procedures should be used for all absences:

On the first day of attendance after an absence, the student must bring a written excuse from parents stating the specific reason for the absence. The note must be presented to the security office before the student may be readmitted to school.

The note should include:

Date the note was written Full name of student

Date (s) absent Reason for the absence

Parent signature and phone number

Once the note is received at the Security Desk, an attendance pass/ receipt will be provided for your records. The slip should be presented to each teacher during the "day" of issue. A student will receive a zero for any work missed during an unexcused absence. If no note is brought, the absence is unexcused. The Attendance Office will attempt to contact the student's parents to be sure they are aware of the absence.

ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL FOR MORE THAN HALF A DAY

A student who is absent from school for more than one-half school day will be considered absent and may not participate in any extracurricular activity on the day of the absence. 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ATTENDANCE POLICY

TARDINESS

Students tardy to school are to check in at the

Security Desk, with a parent or guardian. In an

emergency situation, the student must have a note

from the parent stating the reason for the absence. Tardies are excused on the same basis as the absences. Please see "Absence" on the previous page.

CHECKING IN

Any student arriving at school after 8:30 a.m. must report to the Security Desk and check in. A parent should accompany the student to the Security Desk in order to verify the student's tardiness and time of arrival. Students are not to report directly to class.

CHECKING OUT

The parent/guardian must come to the Security Desk to sign his/her child out of school. Please send a note to the Main Office with your child when you know that he/she will be checking out of school. Please include the date, child's full name and the reason for checking out. This will <u>expedite</u> the procedure for checking out of school. There are will be no checkouts after 3:00.

STUDENT ILLNESS

If you are ill during the school day, report this to your teacher. You will be sent to the counseling office with a pass and your parent/quardian will be notified.

MAKE-UP WORK

When a student has an excused absence, he/she may make-up any work missed. It is the student's responsibility to see that this is done at the teacher's convenience, outside of the regular class period and within five days of return, unless the student circumstances warrant an extension which must be approved by the Instructional Assistant Principal. If the work is not completed, the student receives a zero for the incomplete work. A student who has been suspended must be given the opportunity to make-up the work missed.

STUDENT BEHAVIOR



Students are expected to express pride in themselves and their school through appropriate behavior and dress. Caring for school property and equipment by helping to keep it clean (without litter) expresses pride. Walking not running while in the building; using your inside voice rather than yelling, and keeping to the right as you move through the hallways expresses pride, maturity, cooperation and safety. Refrain from using inappropriate words, language, or gestures. Kind, caring attitudes and behaviors always show class.

Unfortunately some students choose inappropriate actions that cause a major disturbance to our school environment. These actions include but are not limited to: writing graffiti, setting fires, possession and igniting firecrackers, throwing food, possession of eggs, shaving cream, water balloons, water guns, etc. Students involved in this type of activity will be subject to disciplinary action. Tucker is a drug and weapon free school zone and any possession of such items will not be tolerated.

SEXUAL HARASSMENT

Sexual Harassment is a form of misconduct which (1) is not welcomed, (2) is a persistent conduct that is personally offensive, (3) debilitates morale, and (4) interferes with student effectiveness. Harassment will not be tolerated in any form. Harassment comes in many forms including: requests for sexual favors and other verbal, non-verbal, or physical actions of a sexual nature. The harasser can be: any school employee, another student, a 3rd party, (non-student or non-employee). Students that are sexually harassed should report such misconduct to any staff member or an administrator immediately.

SCHOOL VIOLENCE (Bullying and Verbal Threats)

Students that attend Tucker Middle School have the right to go to their classes without the fear of being picked on or being bullied. Verbal threats of any kind will not be tolerated by the administration, and students found guilty of any form of verbal harassment will be suspended and a formal hearing may be held. Students should not make any comments that are inappropriate, risqué, or that may make any individual uncomfortable, whether they are verbal or written. Any body gestures that intimidate others are a form of bullying and will not be allowed.

STUDENT DRESS CODE



A student's dress and grooming are primarily the responsibility of the student and his/her parents. Appropriate articles of clothing, neatness and cleanliness are expected of all students at all times. Attire and appearance that are provocative or inappropriate tend to draw unfavorable attention, interfere with instruction, or threaten health or safety is not acceptable. Student's should adhere to the following:

The wearing of pants below the waist line, bare midriffs, halter tops/ tank tops, shirts with spaghetti straps, "off the shoulder" type shirts, tops/blouses revealing cleavage, short shorts, net/see through garments are not allowed.

Flip-flops, between-the-toe shoes without heels, bedroom shoes, or other footwear that interferes with the freedom of movement is not allowed

Trousers/jeans with holes should not be worn during school hours. All males and females should wear a belt with trousers or pants.

Hats, hoodies, caps, girls' knitted caps/pile caps, scarves, bandanas, or gloves may not be worn in the building, carried in the hand, or hung from pockets.

Excessively long shirts must be tucked in. For safety reasons, pockets must be visible. Oversized jackets or coats that cover pockets are also not allowed; however, they can be worn to school. Once students arrive to school, jackets/coats need to be placed in lockers or teacher's class until the end of the day.

Mini-skirts must NOT be worn to school, even with legging or pantyhose. Shorts, skirts, and dresses should be as close to the knee as possible and loose fitting. These items must reach two inches below the middle finger when the arm is extended toward the knee. Leggings or spandex like pants are not permitted unless worn under allowable "length" skirts. and dresses, pants or skirts with high splits is not allowed.

The administrative staff reserves the right to determine if student dress interferes with the learning process. Parents will be called to bring students appropriate wear or the student will be placed in Inschool Suspension (ISS) until a parent can be reached. (See the Student Code of Conduct for specific consequences)


